- Questions/Answers:
  - Regarding EECBG, I thought it was \$5M nationally, CA looks low. Are these correct?
    - Yes, because it has been determined that other state's (outside of CA) needs are higher
  - How will HOMES and HEERA be modeled?
    - HEERA will be designed as appropriate for communities in need
  - When will HEERA funds be available?
    - First funds should be available mid-next year
  - Regarding the program for audits is there more info you can share about that?
    - That is the SEP RLF program and there is no additional information at this time, application is currently being prepared
  - Do you anticipate that communities that need additional support will continue to be determined by CalEnviroScreen?
    - CalEnviroScreen is a great starting point but we know this data also has gaps for rural and tribal communities so we are looking at other avenues
  - How can we best identify programs and ensure our community is included in the development?
    - We are developing this process, with a strong and deliberate focus on equity
    - The CEC will be hosting workshops so be sure to join CEC's listservs to stay informed of all events, the CEC funding opportunities website that is soon to launch will also be a great resource

- How can LGs access resources for tracking purposes and to avoid double dipping?
  - We need to develop that tool, it is a TBD EM&V project that may be contracted out
- You mentioned that CA is a victim of our own success earlier and I want to advocate for SoCal as a whole because we are such a diverse territory and there are a lot of DACs and I want to be sure we are not all lumped together
  - The CEC will take that comment back to the team

    - Tribal support
  - What do you anticipate being the major barriers to applying for funding?
    - Resources to apply and support funding applications
    - Cost of electricity will be a huge factor/impact on DAC's

    - Many cities asking about EV charging & solar
    - Excited about HOMES & HEERA program; they're already looking to help upgrade homes in community through their SoCalREN funded initiative

  - Smaller cities have greater challenge funding & implementing solar and EV projects
  - Understanding what's coming and when
  - There's a lot of paperwork and smaller communities don't have the resources they need to take advantage of funding
