- o Focus Areas for the New Year
 - Successful Rollout of New Portfolio: LA County and SoCalREN will continue laying the regulatory groundwork for new programs to launch in your communities later next year.



- The CPUC authorized funding for 2024 through 2031
- The budget over 8 years is around \$580,000,000
- Program Metrics and Indicators: SoCalREN team participating in ongoing discussions and working groups to shape future mechanisms for tracking program success.
 - Equity and Market Support Indicators (e.g., count of equity participants and their energy savings, WE&T disadvantaged worker participation, etc.)
 - The CPUC is looking to understand better impacts on equity segment customers based on fuel substitution.
 - Non-Energy Benefits (e.g., access to capital, inclusion of diverse workers, energy savings for equity customers, etc.)
 - Awareness, Knowledge, Attitude, Behavior (e.g., customer and market actor awareness of EE products and services.)
 - Questions/Comments
 - Sumi Gant (Gateway Cities COG) asked if environmental justice could be considered as a non-energy benefit?
 - Lujuana Medina replied that can be added as feedback for the working groups.
 - Pam Bold (High Sierra Energy Foundation) asked for more information on the Awareness, Knowledge, Attitude, Behavior program metrics.
 - Lujuana Medina responded that it is currently outlined in the business plan, but they are working on conducting a study.
 - Laurel added she would send out the decision language included in the meeting follow-up. (ACTION ITEM)
- Other Complementary External Funding Activities
 - EPA Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund
 - SoCalREN and coalition of partners applied for Solar for All grant program funding to build on existing success.
 - Proposed program includes constituent-led resiliency hubs through residential solar + battery storage.
 - California Energy Commission
 - Equitable Building Decarbonization Program (EBDP) guidelines finalized
 - SoCalREN, IREN, and others in coalition will apply to administer SoCal EBDP.
 - CEC is considering incorporating IRA's HOME (\$292M) and HEERA (\$290M) for better alignment.

 - CEC Equitable Building DI Decarbonization Program
 - The Equitable Building Decarbonization Program (EBD Program) will help eligible residential customers electrify their homes at no cost, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and advancing energy equity.
 - The EBD Program will also encourage resiliency to extreme heat, indoor air-quality improvements, energy affordability, grid reliability, and local workforce opportunities.



- The SoCalREN has formed and will lead a coalition of Southern California public agencies, CCAs, RENs and CBOs to apply for the Southern California Region funding
- EBD Direct Install Program
 - The EBD Statewide Direct Install Program will provide building decarbonization upgrades for low-income and moderate-income households in single-family, multifamily, and manufactured homes in under-resourced communities.
 - The program will be administered separately in Northern, Central, and Southern California.
- Program Funding
 - \$783M for the EBD Program (58% for Southern California region)
 - Projects will be funded at a 100% grant rate; projects that leverage other funds will be more competitive
 - Three administrators will be competitively selected (one per region)
- Questions/Comments
 - Pam Bold (High Sierra Energy Foundation) asked so your application will only include the Southern Cal region on the map, and not the whole SoCalREN territory?
 - Lujuana Medina said yes, that is correct. Unfortunately, the CEC cut it that way, but Lujuana can connect Pam to applicants applying for the Central Valley. (ACTION ITEM)
- The Community Based Design Collaborative and Program Pilot
 - California Public Utilities Commission Decision authorized energy efficiency portfolios for 2024-2027 included.
 - CPUC tasked Southern California Regional Energy Network (SoCalREN) with designing a Community Based Collaborative and Program Pilot that facilitates community involvement in energy efficiency program design and delivery.
 - RFP released in January for facilitator/project implementer.
- o REACH 2.0 Multi-family Charge4All
 - California Energy Commission approved \$4 million (with \$1 million match)
 - At least 212 chargers installed in multiple counties at DAC and non-DAC communities
 - Lead implementer is GreenWealth Energy
 - Workforce component—at least two trainees from Green Path Careers, receiving LA Cleantech Incubator/Chargepoint training will be placed. And two people trained with USGBC will be placed.
 - If anyone knows of apartment owners who would be interested, please reach out.
 - Questions/Comments
 - Alelia Parenteau (Santa Barbara) asked if there will be meetings with all the enrolled agencies to discuss these new programs?



- Lujuana Medina said yes, meetings can be scheduled. Rebecca Hausheer added that SCR can meet with any enrolled agency at any frequency.
